Counselling can help you

A diagnosis of breast cancer can be challenging. If you're feeling overwhelmed, anxious or fearful, a counsellor can help you find a way through.

Breast Cancer Foundation NZ (BCFNZ) has partnered with Stratos, a national counselling service, to provide the support you and your family need.

It's free and funded by BCFNZ

- Three sessions of individual counselling (over a 6 month period).
- Face to face, over the phone or via Skype/Zoom.
- Family members can attend sessions with you, or may be eligible to free counselling separately.

Choose your own counsellor

- All Stratos counsellors are fully qualified and are experienced at short-term counselling.
- You'll find their individual profiles online.
- You can view these profiles and choose a counsellor to suit you.
- Or, call Stratos on **0800 787 2867** to discuss who would suit you best.

How to access help

- 1 You can self refer online or ask your GP, breast cancer specialist or breast nurse to complete the attached referral form.
- 2 Post the form to BCFNZ or scan and email it to breastnurse@bcf.org.nz
- 3 Alternatively, complete the application form online from our website breastcancerfoundation.org.nz/counselling
- 4 We then send you a voucher number, password and email link to the counselling service website.
- 5 You then select your location and counsellor, and call them to make an appointment.

Who is eligible?

Anyone who has been diagnosed with breast cancer, or who is receiving preventive treatment for inherited breast cancer risk, may use this service. Referrals may be sent at diagnosis, during treatment, after treatment and if cancer has become advanced. A family member may accompany the patient to counselling.
